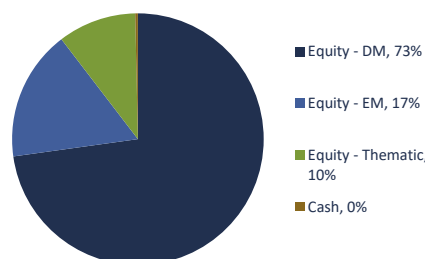

Approach and Style

The Fund aims to generate substantial capital growth in the medium to long term by investing in a variety of asset classes. The Fund utilises a top down approach to asset allocation and will invest across a range of asset classes through funds and a wide universe of equity and bond markets. It is intended that the fund will typically be significantly exposed to equity markets raising its risk profile and making it most suitable for a long term investment. The Fund will benefit from an experienced investment committee who will use a variety of research sources and views to construct the portfolio.

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Commentary

The fund had a positive month overall, gaining 2.51%.

Bond markets took centre stage in August, with sovereign bond yields spiking across major economies towards the end of the month. Investors remain concerned about elevated debt-to-GDP levels and expansive fiscal spending plans such as increased defence expenditure in Europe plus the "Big Beautiful Bill" in the US. Alongside these longer-term structural considerations, reduced energy supply from the Middle East added further inflationary pressure during the month. The 10-year Gilt yield finished the month at 5.06% from a low of 4.89%.

In a timely coincidence, the final week of August marked the annual Jackson Hole Economic Symposium in Wyoming, where central bankers and policymakers gather to discuss the outlook for the global economy. Particular attention was focused on Kevin Warsh, the recently appointed chairman of the Fed, and any clues he might provide regarding policy. Markets had been a little nervous about the extent to which the Federal Reserve might align with President Trump's preference for significantly lower interest rates. However, Chairman Warsh struck

a more hawkish tone, which, although not the direction of travel equity and bond markets would normally hope for, reinforced confidence that monetary policy will be decided at the Federal Reserve, not the White House.

Global equity markets finished the month in positive territory (+1.91% GBP), although several competing forces were at play beneath the surface. Strong corporate earnings, continued enthusiasm surrounding artificial intelligence and the prospect of lower interest rates following weaker US labour market data spurred on stocks during the first half of the month. However, in conjunction with weakness in debt markets, renewed tensions in Iran and the accompanying spike in energy prices, equity sentiment appeared more cautious in tone as August drew to a close.
